
I met Georges Chamchoum. Great man. So Mira, I had asked you to review one of the movies for us. Have you decided?





LOVE & KARMA

It was one of those magical nights at the Asian World Film Festival in November 2025, and the film that stayed with me was LOVE & KARMA, a Philippine movie based on a true story.

The story opens with a woman in her late forties, recently divorced, raising a teenage daughter with whom she has little emotional connection. The struggle is immediate and real. Yet the quiet strength and presence of the lead actress keeps the audience fully engaged.

Encouraged by her friends, she travels to the Philippines. There, she unexpectedly reunites with her first crush. Their connection feels natural and sincere. He is deeply religious, grounded, and disciplined — a rare kind of man. From that moment, love unfolds in a way that is both gentle and powerful. I won't spoil the ending for you, but the journey in this movie, LOVE & KARMA, leaves clear lessons:

**Age does not limit love or opportunity.
Growth begins the moment when curiosity replaces fear.**

**Courage lives outside the comfort zone —
that's where life's wonders happen.**

**True men still exist.
Some treasures require patience and faith to uncover.**

**Every woman carries an inner power;
when released, she becomes unstoppable.**

**Above all, LOVE & KARMA reminds us that
love itself can create miracles.**



In 2017 Georges was named one of the 100 most influential Lebanese in the world. He was honored in a special commemorative publication to mark the occasion.

In December 2018, he received the South Korean Ministry of Culture "Dari Award" on behalf of the Asian World Film Festival for Bridging the Culture of Korea with the USA, and in 2023 was the recipient of the "Dari Award" Person of the Year.

Georges has lived in Los Angeles for over three decades, and travels extensively throughout South-East Asia, Central Asia, the Middle East and China.

GEORGES N. CHAMCHOUM

Georges is an Emmy and multiple award-winning film Director & Producer and Film Festival Organizer born in Niger, West Africa of Lebanese descent. Georges has directed and/or produced over 40 movies between Europe, Africa, Middle East, and the United States. Most of his films have won awards at various International Film Festivals.



Since 1982 Georges has organized numerous film festivals, most notably as Jury Delegate for the Festival du Film Fantastique et de Science Fiction de Paris (France) and as the Executive and Program Director of the Monaco Charity Film Festival.

He currently sits on the Boards of the Yakutsk International Film Festival (Yakutia, Sakha Republic) and the Beirut International Women Film Festival (Lebanon). Georges is also a Board member of the newly-opened Hanoi Film Academy (Vietnam) and works very closely with the Ministry of Culture and Sports of Vietnam and the Vietnam Cinema Association.

In addition, he is Co-founder of Film Festivals Cinergy, a union of film festivals around the world which promotes and champions talent in filmmaking.
